- > ID required : Valid national identity card or passport

Launches

- > Free invitations are allocated subject to availability
- > Certain sites operate a minimum age policy (8, 12 or 16 years old)
- > ID required : Valid national identity card or passport
- > The Carapa site may be visited by all age groups, no invitation necessary

The Space Museum

Entrance fees :

- > Adults : €7
- > Children aged 3 to 10 : €4
- > Children under 3 : free entrance

Reduced entrance fees :

- > Adults : €4
- > Children aged 3 to 10 : €2.5

Reductions granted :

- > to visitors of the Space Centre on the day of their visit
- > to groups of 20 people or more
- > every Saturday

- > From Monday to Thursday : at 8.15am and 13.15pm
- > Fridays : at 8.15am

Museum :

- > Monday to Friday : from 8am to 6pm
- > Saturday : from 2pm to 6pm

The Guiana Space Centre provides five observation sites from which you may watch a launch : Agami, Carapa, Venus, Jupiter and Ibis.

Invitations are allocated subject to available space and depend on the date of the request.

Launches are also broadcast on giant screens in certain districts of Guiana, Cayenne in particular. Entertainment for all ages is also organised.
